News and information from Curdworth Parish Council

Edition 401 (July 2016)

Below is current news from the Parish Council and also a summary of the May minutes which were approved at the June meeting:

Cllr Weatherley was re-elected as Chair and Cllr Vaughton as Vice-Chair.

Playing Fields

With regard to repairs to equipment the Clerk reported that the connectors/bushes on the cradle swings had now been replaced, but that the bushes on the flat swings would also need replacing and a quote would be obtained for this. Table/bench - following contact from a resident regarding replacing the picnic table and bench, the Clerk would obtain costs and look into grant funding available. Updated quotes would also be obtained for the refurbishment of the tennis courts.

Buildings of Special Interest

The Parish Council agreed to compile a list of Buildings of Special Interest in the Community for submission to the Warwickshire Heritage Forum. Councillors identified a number of local buildings which could be included such as the remains of a medieval moat at Hall Farm, Ashleigh Lodge and Curdworth Canal Bridge.



Village Green

Councillors authorised expenditure to tidy up the Village Green as it was very overgrown, the peripheral undergrowth required cutting back and thinning and the pathway clearing, along with some lvy which needed cutting back by residential properties.

Update on Village Defibrillator

The Parish Council hosted the first meeting with a group of volunteers, at which it was agreed to look at joining the Community Heartbeat Scheme. As well as becoming part of an established registered charity, the scheme also provided support in obtaining a Defibrillator. There were numerous other benefits including banking facilities, fundraising support, insurance cover, full training and counselling support. The use of the Village Telephone Box was also discussed and it was felt this would be a convenient central point to house the unit.

Any residents wishing to volunteer to become part of the Heartbeat Scheme are welcome to attend the next meeting which will be held on Sat 16th July 2016 at 10am at St Nicholas Church Hall.

Curdworth Women's Guild - June

The speaker at our June meeting was Mrs Sheila Davies who talked to us of her 'Life in Malawi'. One of seven children, Sheila was born and brought up there, living on a farm in the South of the country. Malawi (formerly Nyasaland) was originally under British rule but there were many protests against this and eventually in 1962 Britain agreed that the country should have its independence. This finally happened in 1964 and Dr Hastings Banda became the Prime Minister. Malawi finally became a Republic in 1966.

Under Dr Banda Malawi thrived, however his rule was harsh and, after declaring himself President for life the country became a dictatorship. The gulf between rich and poor was huge and there was naturally much unrest. In 1992 Malawi suffered a severe drought and some counties suspended foreign aid in protests at his rule so Banda was forced to hold a referendum. The people voted for Democracy and Bilki Muluzi became the new president.

Mrs Davies told us something of her education against this political background. She and her siblings were sent to Boarding School in what was then Southern Rhodesia. It took three days to reach from the family farm, housed 400 pupils and was run by German nuns.

The East side of Malawi is bordered by Lake Malawi which is 365 miles long and many people make their living by fishing. There are also many subsistence farmers and white owned plantations. As well as farming sheep and cattle Malawi's

crops include tea, tobacco, sugar and peanuts.

When Mrs Davies met and married her English husband they made the move to settle in Britain, although she pays frequent visits to her homeland. Malawi is still a poor country but in recent years has achieved strong economic growth. Her talk was full of detail and extremely interesting. It was very much enjoyed by those present.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday July 20th when Geoff Grewcock from The Wildlife Trust will be talking to us about their work, and will be accompanied by a furry or a feathered
