Below is current news from the Parish Council

Birmingham Airport

The September and October meeting was attended by a number of residents who continue to experience problems with low flying aircraft from Birmingham Airport. Representatives from the Airport as well as County Councillor Joan Lea will be attending the November meeting to discuss residents' concerns. It is our understanding that there will shortly be a public consultation regarding changes in flight paths from Birmingham Airport and details of this will be posted on the Parish Council noticeboard. We would encourage residents to respond to the consultation.

Football pitches

The football pitches continue to be used by a number of teams with ongoing enquiries from other teams interested in hiring our facilities.

Dog fouling

There continues to be problems in the village with dog fouling and we would like residents to either use the dog bins around the village or take faeces home with them to dispose of. The Parish Council has ordered an additional dog waste bin which will be located in Farthing Lane. The lane is in regular use by school children and we have noticed an increase in dog fouling in this area.

Patient Participation Groups

Cllr Simkin attended the recent meeting at the Hazelwood Practice in Coleshill and Cllr Evans attended the last meeting at Satis House in Water Orton. Cllr Evans reported that despite rumour the surgery is to remain open and that

new staff are being recruited.

High Speed Rail 2

The Clerk reported she had received a letter from North Warwickshire Borough Council Planning stating that once the hybrid Bill before Parliament is enacted, planning permission will be granted for the construction of this railway line. The Council has agreed that it will become a Qualifying Authority for the purposes of consequential planning applications ie applications dealing with structures such as bridges and viaducts. As a consequence of this NWBC will only have eight weeks in which to determine the applications. If they remain undetermined after this period then planning permission will have been deemed to have been granted by default. In order to adapt to this NWBC has given delegated powers to a small sub-Committee of the main Planning Committee so that meetings can be called quickly.

The letter also pointed out that the remit of NWBC is limited to preserving the local environment or local amenity, reducing the prejudicial effects on road safety grounds or the free flow of traffic as well as heritage impacts. HS2 have indicated that NWBC can expect up to around 164 planning applications phased over the next 3 to 4 years with the first being submitted in Spring 2017, which will include applications in connection with the Delta junction at Water Orton.



Curdworth Community Heartbeat

Curdworth Community Heartbeat is an initiative by a group of volunteers within the village, supported by the Parish Council, whose aim is to purchase and operate a Defibrillator for local residents. These are becoming more and more common, particularly in rural areas, and can literally make the difference between life and death.

Linking up with the national Community Heartbeat Scheme, the cost to purchase, install and train volunteers is in the region of £1300, with a very small ongoing annual maintenance cost. Coleshill and District U3A "7 years in Australia? Rather harsh, m'lud!"

On 17th October, Hugh Sharp gave a very informative talk on the Tolpuddle Martyrs. Many of us have heard of the martyrs, but what do we really know about them?

We were shocked to discover the harshness with which the legal establishment, in 1834, treated these six men, impoverished agricultural labourers from the village of Tolpuddle in Dorset. Their crime? To establish a Friendly Society by swearing a secret oath. For this, they were tried at the assizes in Dorchester, and sentenced to transportation to Australia for 7 years.

Many people thought this punishment too severe and campaigned for a lesser sentence. Their sentence was reduced to two years. Money was collected to assist them on their return. This money was used to lease two farms in Greensted, Essex. Persecuted by their new community, 5 of the martyrs and their families emigrated to Canada, and settled in London, Ontario. Only 1 returned to Tolpuddle.

Facts at a glance:

- * the six men were Thomas Standfield, John Standfield, George Loveless, James Loveless, James Brine and James Hammett
- * they swore a secret oath illegal at the time to defend themselves against the threat of increasing mechanisation.
 * in 1830, 'Captain Swing' riots took place in Sussex and Kent, during which hayricks were burned in the blackness of night.
 (An example had been set, in 1811, by the Luddites in Nottinghamshire who had destroyed mill machinery.)
 * originally, Maryland or Virginia in America was the destination for convicts. After the loss of these colonies, Botany Bay in Australia became their destination.

The village of Curdworth is recorded in the Domesday Book of 1087 and the historic church of St Nicholas is itself now over 850 years old. Our church is used by Curdworth residents and other local people for baptisms, weddings, funerals and of course regular Christian worship. It is a busy place and the centre of much activity.

St Nicholas is a listed building and subject to frequent inspection. The latest published report highlighted significant problems with damp. Urgent repairs are needed to replace damaged or missing roof tiles, defective flashings and inadequate gutters and downpipes. The tower in particular needs urgent attention.

Our Vicar and church officials are attempting to secure grants from various outside agencies to fund the necessary repairs and that work is continuing. We are spending our own money to replace the lighting and heating within the church to reduce energy costs.

Some Curdworth residents currently help the church by monthly standing order. The benefit to the longterm future of the church is enormous. These donations are 'gift aided'. If you are a taxpayer, then under current HMRC rules your donations are tax deductible.

This is your village and your church. If you believe St Nicholas is worth preserving for future generations, will you please help us to do so.
